I have (something) or **I've got** (something) = It is mine.

I **have** a new car.

I've **got** a new car.

Sue **has** long hair.

Sue **has got** long hair.

have

I have (something) or **I've got** (something) = It is mine.

I **have** a headache.

I've **got** a headache.



UNIT 58

have

The past is **I had** (without **got**) / **I didn't have** / **Did you have?** etc.

When I first met Sue,
she **had** short hair.

He didn't have any money
because he **didn't have** a job.



UNIT 58

have

In these expressions **have** = **eat** / **drink** / **take** etc.
You can't use 'have got'.

'Where's Lisa?'

'She's **having** lunch.'



UNIT 58

have

We also use **have** (not have got) in these expressions.

We're **having** a party next week.

You must come.

Enjoy your holiday. **Have** a nice time!
