In general we do not use **the** with names of **places**.

Peru is in **South America**.

But we use **the** in names with 'republic' / 'states' / 'kingdom'.

the Czech Republic

the United States of America (the USA)

the United Kingdom (the UK)

We use **the** with plural names of **countries** / **islands** / **mountains**.

the Netherlands

the Philippines

We use **the** with names of **oceans** / **seas** / **ivers** / **canals**.

the Atlantic (Ocean)

the (River) Nile

the... <names of places>

In general we do not use **the** with names of **streets, squares** etc.

Kevin lives in **Newton Street**.

We do not use **the** with names of **airports**, **stations** and many other important **buildings**.

Kennedy Airport

Harvard University

But we use **the** with names of most **hotels, museums, theatres** and **cinemas**.

the National Theatre

the Science Museum

We use **the** + names with... **of**...

the Great Wall **of** China

the Tower **of** London

We say **the north** / **the south** / **the east** / **the west** (of...).

I've been to **the north of Italy**,
but not to **the south**.
