not + any / no / none



The car park is empty.

There aren't **any** cars
There are **no** cars] in the car park.

How many cars are there in the car park?

None.



UNIT 77

not + any / no / none

not (-n't) + any

Tracey and Jack don't have any children.

no... = not any or not a

We have no coffee.

(= We don't have any coffee.)



UNIT 77

not + any / no / none

negative verb + **any** = positive verb + **no**

There **isn't any** sugar in your coffee.

There's **no** sugar in your coffee.



UNIT 77 not + any / no / none

Use **none** alone (without a noun).

‘How much money do you have?’

‘**None.**’ (= no money)



UNIT 77

not + any / no / none

None is an answer for **How much?** / **How many?**
(things or people)

- A** **How many** people did you meet?
- B** **None.** (= no people)
