the exam.

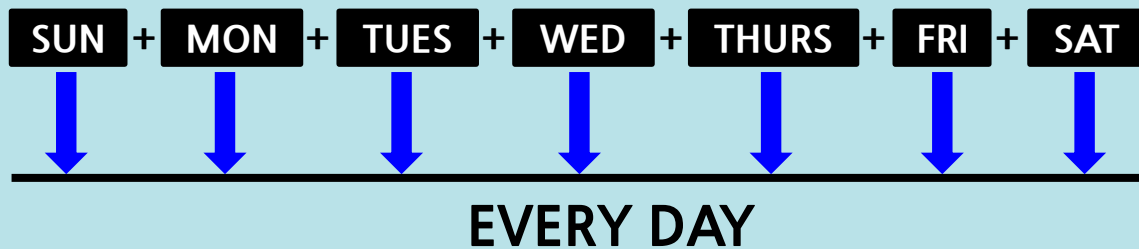

How often?



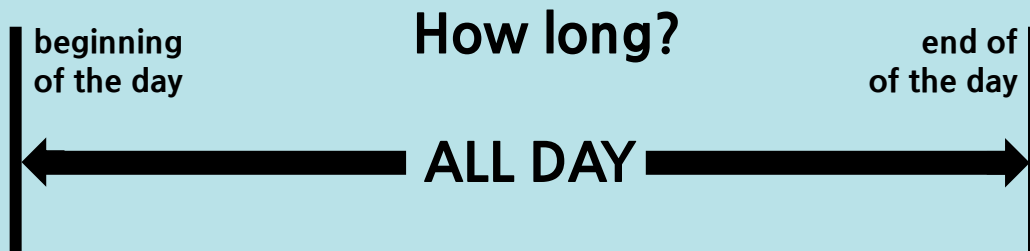
It rained **every day** last week.
