some cars

many cars

Uncountable nouns have only one form.

money

the money

my money

some money

much money

Money isn't everything.

# a bottle / some water <countable / uncountable 1>

You can't use **a / an** + uncountable nouns. ~~a~~ money ~~a~~ music ~~a~~ water  
But you can say **a piece of...** / **a bottle of...** etc. + uncountable noun.

a bottle of water

a carton of milk

a bar of chocolate

a piece of cheese

a bottle of perfume

a piece of music

a bowl of rice

a cup of coffee

a game of tennis
