We use **not** (**n't**) in negative sentences.

I'm **not** tired.

Julian **wasn't** hungry.

I **haven't** finished my work.

George **can't** drive.

don't / doesn't / didn't

I **want** to go out.

Lisa **plays** the guitar.

Emily **had** dinner with us.



I **don't want** to go out.

Lisa **doesn't play** the guitar.

Emily **didn't have** dinner with us.

Don't...

Wait for me. ➡ Don't wait for me.

Sometimes **do** is in the main verb.

Do something! ➡ Don't do anything!
